VALIDITY OF ORDERS AND SUCCESSION

In order to provide information to those who are interested in the validity of Holy Orders of Bishop David Cooper and his Apostolic Succession (succession of the bishops in an unbroken line from the original Apostles) the following is presented.

ORTHODOX CHURCH OF MOSCOW - RUSSIAN ORTHODOX

Macarius of Moscow, Evdokim, Aftimios Ofiesh and eight other Russian Bishops appear in this line prior to Bishop David Leon Cooper. One of these, Peter A. Zurawetsky was also consecrated by Archbishop Constantin Kuryllo of the Russian Synodical Church, along with ten others prior to the name of Bishop David Leon Cooper. The Russian Archbishop in America Tikon obtained permission for the formation of an entire exarchate of national Orthodox churches, with their own Bishops. The Patriarch Tikon, of Moscow then authorized Archbishop Afteimios Ofiesh to found and head, under a synodical constitution, the American Orthodox Catholic Church. Our Russian lines come through these men

ROMAN CATHOLIC SUCCESSION - THROUGH MEXICO

At the end of the last century there lived in El Oviedo, in Mexico, a Roman Catholic bishop who was retired and was called Msgr. Eduardo Sanchez Camecho, Bishop of Tamaulipas. He consecrated Msgr. Benedict Donkin, Bishop of the Holy Cross in Sicily. In turn, in London, England, in 1905 this bishop consecrated 13 others to the episcopate. Bishop David Leon Cooper has this succession.

ROMAN CATHOLIC SUCCESSION - THROUGH BRAZIL

Ten Roman Catholic Bishops or Archbishops preced the bishops for the Western Orthodox Church. This includes the former Patriarch of the Igreja Apostolica Catholica Braseleira, which was founded by Dom Carlose Duarte Costa, former Roman Catholic Bishop of Sao Paulo, Brazil. The recent Bishop Locke stands in this line of succession and includes at least five Roman Catholic Cardinals.

ANGLICAN AND AMERICAN EPISCOPAL CHURCH

These lines, with many names, were passed on to us by Bishop Alan Bain.

OLD CATHOLIC CHURCH OF UTRECHT

Originally the Old Catholic Church of Utrecht, then the Old Catholic Church from continental Europe, then the Old Roman Catholic Church in the U.S., the Liberal Catholic, and the Mariavite Succession from Poland. Bishop David Leon Cooper received these lines.

GREEK MELKHITE CATHOLIC SUCCESSION (UNIATE)

Archbishop Sawaya, Melkhite Catholic Patriarch of Antioch and all the East, in the U.S.A. consecrated nineteen Bishops in this line of succession which were passed on to Bishop David Leon Cooper through three different routes.

MARIAVITE SUCCESSION - FROM OLD CATHOLIC CHURCH OF UTRECHT

Sixteen Bishops, from the Archbishop of Utrecht have conferred the Mariavite succession to Bishop David Leon Cooper.

COPTIC ORTHODOX SUCCESSION

Fourteen Bishops standing in this line have conferred their succession to Bishop David Leon Cooper.

UKRAINIAN ORTHODOX CHURCH SUCCESSION (CANADA)

In 1950, the Ukrainian Metropolitan from Canada +Nicholas Bohatyretz, in company with four other of his Bishops, conferred on the Bishops of the Catholic Charismatic Church, their succession; thus Bishop David Leon Cooper received these lines.

POLISH OLD CATHOLIC CHURCH SUCCESSION

Metropolitan + Joseph Zielonka, with two other Bishops conferred their succession on 10 others, who consecrated the Bishops of Christ Catholic Orthodox Church. Bishop Cooper also has received this succession.

THE ORDER OF CORPORATE REUNION SUCCESSION

At the direction of the Roman See, a plan for introducing valid Orders into the Church of England as a Roman Uniate movement was adopted. A Greek, a Coptic and a Roman Catholic Bishop, whose names were sealed, but who were guaranteed canonical, consecrated three bishops: Lee, Mossman, and Seecombe, two of whom consecrated

Stevens who in turn consecrated thirteen men in this line of succession. The plan ultimately failed, but the bishops so consecrated were valid. Bishop David Leon Cooper has this line of succession.

PATRIARCHAL SEE OF ANTIOCH SUCCESSION VAILATTE SUCCESSION

Mar +Peter Ignatius III, 126th Patriarch of Antioch and Bishop +Alvarez, consecrated seven priests as bishops, who then passed on the succession to seventeen others. Bishop David Leon Cooper received these lines of succession.

OLD CATHOLIC SEE OF UTRECHT

Twenty-one bishops stand in this line of succession, which was passed on to Bishop David Leon Cooper by consecration.

PATRIARCHAL SEE OF CONSTANTINOPLE - GREEK ORTHODOX

This is the Old Calendar Greek Succession by Archbishop +Makarios of Cyprus, and others, who consecrated Bishop +Theolkitos of Salamis, Greece, who in turn passed on this succession to ten others, by whom it came to Bishop David Leon Cooper. Then +Metipolis, Bishop of the Holy Mountain, (Greek Orthodox), assisted by Bishop +Kisis, of The Albanian Orthodox church, consecrated +Fan S. Noli, who added six more bishops to the line which was transmitted also to Bishop David Leon Cooper.

Five original partiarchates were formed and universally recognized in the Church. The original patriarchates, four in the east and one in the west were:

CONSTANTINOPLE (Modern Istanbul)
ANTIOCH
ALEXANDRIA (In Egypt)
JERUSALEM, and
ROME

Constantiniple established the Moscow Patriarchate to serve the Russians and Scythian Churches.

Moscow established the exarchate for the U.S.A. and Canada.

Rome remained Orthodox until the 11th century when the Vatican Curia was established and the Papacy of the West and the Roman Catholic Church was born, repudiating dependence upon any other of the original patriarchies...

Charles Maurice LeTellier, son of the Grand Chancellor of France, who succeeded the Archbishop of Rheims. On 12 November 1668, he consecrated, in the Church of the Cordeliers, Pontiose,

James Benigne Bissuet (The Eagle of Meaux) the Illustirous, as Bishop of Condon. He was transferred of the See of Meaux by Pope Clement on 21 September 1670. In 1671, in the Church of Charitreuse of Paris, he consecrated

James Goyon de Matignon, son of the Count de Thorigny, as Bishop of Condon. He was an import tax collector of Lisilieux and Honorary Vicar of St. Victor in Paris. By order of Pope Clement XI, he consecrated in Paris, in 1693

Dominic of Varlet, Bishop of Ascalon (in partribus) and coadjustor to the Bishop of Babylon, Persia. Retireing to Holland, he died twenty-three years later in the Cistercian Abbey of Rhjinwich. Having in response to the appeals of the Chapter of Utrecht. on 12 February 1739 he consecrated

Peter John Meindaerts, Bishop of Utrecht. He had been one of several priests ordained in Ireland, by Like Fagan, Bishop of Meath, afterwards Archbishop of Dublin, with the view of sustaining the Ancient Church of the Netherlands, founded by Saint Willibrood in the seventh centry. By his consecration to the episcopate the succession in Holland hw been perpetuated. On 17 October 1739 he consecrated

John Van Spithout, Bishopof Haarlem. On 11 July 1745, he consecrated

Walter Michael van Niewenbuizen, Archbishop of Utrecht. On 7 February 1768, he consecrated
